WRITE THE WINTER AWAY CHALLENGE

Need a starter for your writing? Borrow an idea from Charles Schultz to rev up your words this winter and get ready for a warmer spring.

Here is how it works:

Pick a feeling and answer the questions below about it.

- 1. What season would the feeling be?
- 2. What color is the feeling?
- 3. What sound does the feeling make?
- 4. If the feeling were an animal, what animal would it be?
- 5. What does the feeling taste like?
- 6. What musical instrument would the feeling be?
- 7. What would you do to change this into something else?

Then pick a favorite answer and expand on it.

Example: Word—Boredom

Boredom is winter with an overcast sky. Boredom is brown like a banana gone too ripe.

Boredom drips, drips, drips like a worn faucet.

Boredom is a sloth dragging its way home to sleep.

Boredom is potato chips with no salt. Boredom is a clarinet practicing scales. If I could, I would shoot boredom out of a cannon so it glittered the sky.

Expanded line:

Boredom is brown

like a banana gone too ripe.

At first, you hardly notice its yellow fading. Then you see brown speckles, and you feel a little uneasy, but you don't do anything about it.

Next, you see the spots merge, and realize it is almost too late. If you have the nerve to peel away the skin, you can see that the gray flesh is not what you want at all.

You should have done something with it—maybe a fruit salad or smoothie or banana bread—before it started oozing over the counter and pinning you to the floor.

You might start with a good feeling word like "security" or "comfort."
